1.0 <u>Purpose/Summary of Report</u>

- 1.1 This report is intended to support the Community Scrutiny Committee in planning its work programme for 2008/09.
- 2.0 <u>Contribution to the Council's Corporate Priorities/Objectives</u>
 - 2.1 In monitoring the performance of the council's services and action plans, the Committee is monitoring the Council's achievement of all of its corporate objectives.
 - 2.2 Any additional issues identified for scrutiny will relate to at least one of the Council's corporate objectives.
 - 2.3 Effective use of the scrutiny process contributes to the Council's ability to meet two core objectives:

4.0 Report

- 4.1 Following further work by the Performance Indicators task and finish group (under Corporate Business Scrutiny Committee) it has been agreed that in future, Healthcheck reports will now be presented to each scrutiny committee. These reports will give the most up-to-date data available covering the PIs relevant to the terms of reference to that committee. The first of these new style reports is elsewhere on the agenda for this meeting.
- 4.2 Some additional items for Community Scrutiny's consideration have been proposed by Councillor Nigel Clark. The three items are outlined below and the Committee are invited to consider: a) whether they wish scrutinise these matters and b) if so, when they would wish to do so. The items proposed are
 - A report on how the pools will operate under the new contract from January 2009.
 - The outcome of the free swimming day on August 24th to coincide with the Olympics hand over.
 - The arguments for and against offering free swimming for over 60s: particularly, the factors considered in coming to the decision to apply, how the scheme will operate, how the risk has been transferred to the new operator etc..
- 4.3 The Committee already receives a standing Leisure Performance report. The report provided elsewhere on this agenda does include the outcome of the 24 August free swimming day. The Director of Customer and Community Services has also asked Sports and Leisure Management (SLM) to give a presentation to Council on 10 December 2008 to describe how they will run the leisure centres (including the pools) and other related services. He has also asked SLM to arrange visits for members to one of their existing contract sites to give members an idea of the "feel" of the quality services

they intend to provide.
