# Purpose/Summary of Report

- 1.0 <u>Background</u>

#### 2.0 <u>Report</u>

- 2.1 The Medium Term Financial Plan and proposed savings are already set out for the next 4 years. Essential Reference Paper C is an extract from the MTFP with forward items under Environment Scrutiny remit tagged in green.
- 2.2 The 2011/12 Capital Programme proposals are also already published. Essential Reference Paper D is an extract from this document with forward items under Environment Scrutiny remit tagged in green.
- 2.3 Members are asked to choose from the MTFP and Capital Programme some specific issues (which fall under their remit) to review in more detail at a future meeting of this committee. Members are asked to focus on 2011/12 financial year at this time.
- 2.4 After the close of accounts for the 2009/10 financial year, officers will have the opportunity to set out.
  - Services which are performing considerably over or under target.
  - Services which are significantly over or under spent on budget.

Once this data is available, members will have another chance to identify further budgetary issue(s) to scrutinise at a later meeting.

2.5 Following the CBS meeting on 11 May 2010, an additional item has been added to the work programme of this committee. A report setting out the business case for the Hertford Theatre (Castle Hall) Hydro project should be available for the meeting on 14 September 2010 – however this is still dependent on the new government clarifying its position on funding for projects of this type including rates for "Feed-In Tariffs".
