there should be a further assessment to determine the exposure of the windows to industrial noise. Rapleys request further conditions to this effect if the EHO considers this approach to be acceptable.

The applicant submitted further information following earlier submissions on behalf of Allinsons (in a letter dated 26 March 2018). In this, it sets out that it recognises the legitimate concern of Allinson in relation to the occupiers of the proposed hotel and it is its intention to ensure that the windows of this building are non-openable. It suggests a condition to this effect.

The applicant further sets out that, in relation to the residential uses, if it was felt necessary that the acoustic performance of the windows in the residential units needs to be assessed, it would agree to a further condition requiring that the design of the windows be agreed prior to their installation.

Building Sustainability

Members have been circulated with a further submission from the <u>Bishop's Stortford Climate Change Group</u>, dated 27 March 2018. The Group reminds members of its earlier submissions and sets out conditions that it considers should be attached to any decision.

Additional representations from residents

An additional representation has been received from a member of the public. It refers to unsafe road conditions for pedestrians at the top of the steps from the lower Station Road level to the higher level where three roadways converge and no pedestrian footway is available.

It is suggested that the applicant should seek to provide a cycle/ pedestrian footbridge over the railway and that this would remove road traffic as a safer route would encourage more journeys by foot/ cycle. The current proposals (removing the southward down ramp from Station Road) are considered to result in poorer safety proposals are policy compliant.

Officers are of the view that the conditions sought by the Climate Group are unreasonably specific as they stand and would not comply with the relevant tests for conditions. However, it is suggested that a further condition is applied requiring the submission of further energy strategy and sustainability details. This can be informed by independent advice secured by the Council and is in line with the approach proposed in relation to the previous proposals.

This will be covered by the additional authority sought below with regard to conditions.

Additional representations

The further representations are noted. It is considered that the issues raised are addressed by the report.
