Changes to the Conservation Area Boundary.	One respondent commented that 'Moor Place' has a strong historical association with Much Hadham and is linked through to the village by the principle drive and parkland. The house together with its parkland is both historically and visually linked to the village and adds significance special interest to the character of the conservation area.'	Officers agree with this comment and continue to propose that the conservation area boundary is extended to include Moor Place.
Important Views	One respondent has suggested additional views be added to the document. These are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The whole of the High Street from Spindle Bridge to Hadham Cross</li> <li>• The view of the Church across the meadow in front of the Palace adjacent to North Leys</li> </ul>	Officers agree that these views are significant and they have been added to the document and associated maps.

<p>Other minor points</p>	<p>One respondent makes reference to comments made in paragraphs 5.4 and 5.6 of the document. They suggest Malting Lane, Oudle Lane and Church Lane contribute to the linear nature of the High Street and the River Ash.</p> <p>One respondent notes that no reference is made to Morris Cottage which was the residence of William Morris's sister and is a rare example of Philip Webb's Arts and Crafts rear extension.</p> <p>One respondent questioned why the Palace Field has not been designated as Historic Park and Garden.</p> <p>Enhancement works to the highways in Much Hadham was commented upon by one respondent.</p>	<p>Officers agree and appropriate amendments have been made to the document.</p> <p>Morris Cottage is a Grade II listed building originally dating from the 15<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> centuries purchased by William Morris for his sister Henrietta. Officers are of the view that this building with its historic associations is worth of inclusion within the document.</p> <p>The designation of Historic Parks and Gardens goes beyond the remit of the Appraisal process</p> <p>These works go beyond the remit of the Appraisal process.
