• Impact of Manchester Airports Group (MAG) parking policies on parking in Bishop's Stortford

As a result of this scrutiny proposal, the Stansted Airport Parking Complaints telephone number is now listed on the East Herts Council website; officers (Head of Communications, Strategy and Policy and Parking Manager) are now included in all circulation of papers for the Stansted Airport Highways Working Group; two Members of the Committee have been invited to attend the Stansted Area Transport Forum on 8th March.
