

## ESSENTIAL REFERENCE PAPER 'A'

### IMPLICATIONS/CONSULTATIONS:

Contribution to the Council's Corporate Priorities/ Objectives :	Priority 1 – Improve the health and wellbeing of our communities.  Priority 2 – Enhance the quality of people's lives.
Consultation:	Undertaken with residents and local stakeholders and summarised in Essential Reference Paper B.
Legal:	Preparation of the Appraisal fulfils statutory requirements.
Financial:	Costs associated with the preparation of the Appraisal are met from within existing staffing and operational budgets.  The Appraisal suggests works and actions which could be undertaken to enhance the character and appearance of the conservation area which would generally be the responsibility of individual owners. Other actions such as the possible introduction of an Article 4 Direction might result in additional cost but notwithstanding approving a pilot study elsewhere the Council is not yet committed to undertaking such further action in Great Hornead. Such costs can be further assessed should such a decision be reached. Any grant assistance for historic buildings may be sought from existing resources.
Human Resource:	No additional staffing implications.

Risk Management:	No significant risk issues.
Health and Wellbeing – issues and impacts:	The Appraisal seeks to protect and secure the character of the area.
