10. SUBSTITUTES AT MEETINGS

- <u>'D' RECOMMENDATION</u> that (A) substitute Members be allowed on the basis of notification being given by the absent Member and not the Group Leader; and
 - (B) the Director of Corporate Governance be authorised to amend the Constitution accordingly.

1.0 Purpose/Summary of Report

- 1.1 To amend the Constitution in respect of the arrangements for substitute Members at meetings.
- 2.0 Contribution to the Council's Corporate Priorities/Objectives
- 2.1 The work of the Council's meetings supports all of the Council's priorities.
- 3.0 Report
- 3.1 Annual Council in May 2006, amended the Constitution to include provisions for substitute arrangements at meetings of the Council's committees, sub-committees and panels.
- 3.2 Experience has shown that a slightly more flexible approach would be helpful to ensure that Members can play as active a role as possible at formal meetings. It is suggested that the provisions be amended so that the absent Member is required to notify the Head of Democratic Services that a substitute will be attending in his/her place. There will be no requirement for the Group Leader to provide any notification.
- 3.3 If Council is minded to approve this, the Director of Corporate

Governance should be authorised to amend the Constitution accordingly.
