- 1.1 To appoint the Section 151 Officer.

- 3.0 Background
- 3.1 The Council is required to appoint formally the statutory position of the Chief Financial Officer (Section 151 Officer) under Section 151 of the Local Government Act 1972.
- 4.0 Report
- 4.1 Council is invited to consider the appointment to the Chief Financial Officer (Section 151 Officer) post.
- 4.2 According to the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA) there are five key roles that area critical to the achievement of a Chief Finance Officer's statutory responsibilities;
 - maintaining strong financial management underpinned by effective financial controls;
 - contributing to corporate management and leadership;

- supporting and advising democratically elected representatives;
- supporting and advising officers in their operational roles; and
- leading and managing an effective and responsive financial service.
- 4.3 Following a recruitment process, Alan Madin has been appointed as the Director of Internal Services. He will commence his duties on 2 March 2009 and it is proposed that he be appointed as the Council's Section 151 Officer. Alan Madin has considerable expertise and experience and has the appropriate qualifications.
- 5.0 Consultation
- 5.1 The Council's External Auditors have been consulted.
- 6.0 <u>Legal Implications</u>
- 6.1 It is a Council function to appoint the Council's statutory officers.
- 7.0 Financial Implications
- 7.1 The Section 151 officer is responsible for the sound administration of the Council's financial affairs.

- 9.1 Council is required by statute to make these appointments.
