2010/11 SERVICE PLANS

#### Purpose/Summary of Report

The purpose is to set out the planned service activity for 2010/11. Members are asked to scrutinise the attached plans and that Executive be recommended to agree the 2010/11 Service Plans at their meeting on 9 March 2010.

## **RECOMMENDATION FOR DECISION:**

that the attached service plan activity for 2010/11 be scrutinised and the Executive be recommended to agree the planned activity for 2010/11.

- 1.0 <u>Background</u>
- 1.1 East Herts uses an integrated service planning and financial management framework to ensure that all services deliver the Sustainable Community Strategy and the Corporate Priorities.
- 1.2 Service Plans are produced every year by Heads of Service and set out the key actions that need to be undertaken to deliver the corporate priorities and key objectives, in line with the budget. These actions (where relevant) are linked to key performance indicators, so that achievement can be measured and tracked.
- 2.0 <u>Report</u>
- 2.1 All service plans have been checked to ensure compliance with the service planning guidance and all sections have been completed. For ease, only Table 3a, which set out the key actions for each service, have been detailed in **Essential Reference Paper 'B'**. The

rest of the service plan, which largley contains contextual information about the service, will be published on the Council's intranet to support Table 3a.

- 2.2 Overall, the actions detailed reflect the Consolidated Budget report that was presented to Joint Scrutiny Committees on 19 Janaury 2010 and Executive on 9 February 2010.
- 2.3 The 2010/11 Service Plan activity will be monitored on a six monthly basis but will be reported to the relevant scrutiny committee for each service (like the Corporate Healthcheck Report), rather than all being reported to Corporate Business Scrutiny. The only exception to this will be the last six monthly monitoring report, which relates to the period October March, as this will need to be presented at a Joint Scrutiny Committees meeting. The reason for this is that the timing of Community and Environment Scrutiny committees post April 2011 are scheduled to take place later in the summer. These meeting dates would be too late to enable members of those two Committees to have a timely discussion on the outcomes.
