- c) Whether the report notes that the White bridge was an early obligation to enable Goodsyard development.
- d) Whether the HCC part of the s106 includes improvements to Dane Street key bus, walk and cycle route for Goodsyard.
- e) Whether the s106 includes upgrade of the towpath off-site from White bridge to Station Road.
- f) Whether there is a crystal-clear undertaking for the opening of Sextons Road with this recommendation.

- c) The extant S106 does not include any direct reference or obligation to enable this development. The majority of the bridge falls outside of the BISH8 allocation.
- d) The extant and draft s106 agreements include an Accessibility Contribution for HCC to deploy, at its discretion, in the immediate vicinity of the application site in order to make improvements.
- e) A contribution has been negotiated under the extant permission in order for the third party landowner of the White Bridge (EHDC) to make improvements at its discretion.
- f) Sexton Road sits outside the boundary of this current application. It is subject to a s278 agreement with HCC Highways, delivered under the extant permission. The road has been built and is ready for use, pending only to final HCC approval processes (including changing the bus services) to complete and allow opening. The applicant has subsequently confirmed that registration period for changing a bus service is

- g) And for the long-delayed implementation of the footway to white bridge which should now be in place.
- h) Has the case planner seen options for the design of the junction of Sextons Road and Dane Street currently very difficult for pedestrians, and the reason why Solum envisages removing steps on the E-W walking route.
- i) Whether the case officer negotiated changes to the block of housing directly adjacent the railway sidings where noisy operations take place at night. This was originally part of the site I understand, then retained. As a consequence the sidings seriously constrain design.

- around 6 weeks and that needs to coincide with the agreed service change dates. Allowing for that coordination, the applicant envisages HCC should notify that the road can be opened to buses around early July.
- g) Preparations of the area surrounding the White Bridge are underway. Works on site will be starting shortly and are due to conclude by early Autumn.
- h) Extant conditions cover this area and appropriate strategies for pedestrians.
- i) The block F (outline) underwent design work in conjunction with the Environmental Health Officer, including on site technical assessments. A condition requires acoustic insulation. Full details will be submitted at reserved matters stage.
- j) The design of block C is in keeping with the surrounding built form and consistent with the Refined Masterplan (2022). The Council's Urban

- k) Whether the recommendation includes provision for PTE Architects to retain oversight during building design, to avoid watering-down of quality we have seen with Bellway.
- I) Whether the report addresses the implementation of the replacement bus stand which arguably should have happened first in a scheme of this magnitude, and which will happen last.
- m) What is the position on amendment to the hotel application and likely programme.

Design Officer fully supports the proposed development subject to conditions.

- k) The design quality will be manged via condition. The applicant has verbally confirmed that PTE could be retained throughout the detailed design stages for parts of the site.
- There are existing agreements between NR and HCC relating to the provision of bus infrastructure, including delivery timing commitments.
- m) Updated information has been received and is subject to a further statutory consultation period. It is likely the application will be progress to committee early Autumn 2025.
- n) The applicant suggests that delivery has been frustrated by the selection and procurement of an appropriate contractor and preparation is now underway.
- o) This has been resolved (covered in this report) and conditioned.

- n) Why the Network Rail land surrounding the bridge is so badly neglected in the meantime.
- o) Whether flood risk and runoff issues have been resolved and what concessions were necessary to achieve this.
- p) I know the link from Station Road and office building have reverted to the outline app, but please make clear that left-over detailed drawings are not being approved.

A comment has been received regarding the step free ramp by Station Road/ Dane Street

p) Confirmed. The link now forms part of the outline submission. No drawings are listed for approval.

As noted in p) above; the step free access/link/ramp not forms part of the outline application. Further design details will be submitted at the relevant reserved matters stage.
