Financial:	<p>Funding of £29,000 to deliver an increased level of safety-related enforcement around schools and in other sensitive areas was awarded with effect from 2012/13. It has not been possible to use this funding as intended due to continued Government uncertainty as to the future of ANPR-based parking enforcement.</p> <p>The proposal in this report is to deliver many of the intended aims of the earlier ANPR-based enforcement proposal by way of the more 'orthodox' method of deploying a Civil Enforcement Officer to sensitive areas such as school 'zig-zags'.</p> <p>Although the primary purpose of enforcement is to secure compliance with parking regulations it is likely that a small amount of additional penalty charge income will be generated through the deployment of this additional CEO.</p>
