6. VALIDATION OF PLANNING APPLICATIONS – NATIONAL AND LOCAL LIST CONSULTATION

Purpose/Summary of Report

• To agree, for consultation purposes, a revised 'local list' of validation requirements for planning applications.

RECOMMENDATION:		
(A)	That consultation with relevant stakeholders on the revised 'local list' of validation requirements for planning applications be approved.	

- 1.0 <u>Background</u>
- 1.1 Members may recall that amended regulations came into effect on 6th April 2008 regarding the information and details which are required to be submitted in order to validate planning applications. As a result of those regulations, the Council adopted a 'local list' of validation requirements in June 2008. Revised best practice guidance published in March 2010 sets out new national requirements, including the type of form to be completed, the appropriate fee, statements and drawings which must be submitted with each application.
- 1.2 The new guidance also asks local authorities to review and update their established local validation requirements, and to show how these respond to local circumstances and adopted Local Plan policies.
- 1. 3 Accordingly, Officers have reviewed and updated the 'local list', and have provided a summary list which sets out the policy driver for each requirement.

- 1.4 The revised local list and summary list for East Herts is attached to this report as **Essential Reference Paper 'B'.**
- 1.5 The Council is required to formally consult on its revised 'local list' prior to its adoption. Members are therefore asked to approve the attached list for consultation purposes. Thereafter, the Head of Planning and Building Control will prepare a formal consultation document, carry out a six week consultation exercise, and report the responses back to the committee, together with any resulting changes proposed, prior to its adoption.
- 1.6 On adoption, the local list will be used to validate applications. If an applicant submits an application that is not in accordance with both the national and local lists, the authority will be entitled to declare the application invalid, and so decline to determine it.
