Activities and targets for 2018/19

During 2018/19, CVSBEH will provide and/or participate in the following:

Training workshops

Delivery of a minimum of **8** training workshops to no fewer than 80 participants (of which at least **40** will be from East Herts groups) CVSBEH ran a bespoke training course based around employability for Windhill21 in Bishops Stortford in May. This course was attended by **10** members of staff.

4 training courses have now taken place as part of the Hertfordshire Community Foundation Training and Development 2018-19 Programme.

Social Return on Investment (SRoI)

CVSBEH senior staff member to attend two day SROI training and develop learning resources on SROI for East Herts community groups, building CVS knowledge and identifying opportunities for shared learning/development and furthering of Health & Wellbeing outcomes

A HACT analysis was carried out on a recent Wareside Survey.

A follow up survey in February 2018 resulted in 16 matching responses from both surveys. Analysis of these 16 surveys revealed positive improvements within the questions, which when inputted into the HACT Social Value Calculator, gave a return of £108,000 on the £8,000 investment. These were primarily achieved through :

- Things to do for young people
- Less perception of crime / fear of crime in the community
- Less problems with litter

Local Projects

<u>Tower Road Welly Trail</u> – Implemented in June 2018, planting old wellies around Tower School and Ash Valley Children's Centre to deliver a community based project, and give the area an identity.

<u>Pinehurst Mural</u> - This was delivered during August 2018 as a project between local residents, Network Homes and Courtyard Arts. It was officially opened on 21st November 2018. Two East Herts District Councillors attended.

<u>SELF Course - Attended by Community Engagement</u> Officer at University of Hertfordshire.

Volunteer Day

CVSBEH and East Herts Council are working together to organise a staff volunteering day due to take place at the Nigel Copping Community Building on 31st July 2018.

Green Team

This project has now been completed in partnership with Network Homes.

Ridgeway Regeneration Team vegetable growing. Each new property to be provided with vegetable growing box and healthy recipe calendar.

Oomph!

Potentially working with Herts Sports Partnership and Sport England to develop a chair based exercise project in Ware and Hertford.

Social Prescribing

Meeting with East Herts Council looking at how the Social Prescribing Project can continue.

Bishops' Stortford Hub

Partnership with East Herts Council's Economic Development team to look at replicating skills hub model in Bishop's Stortford.





Sele Farm Youth Engagement Project

This project ran from May to September 2018 with funding from East Herts. Funding has also been secured from East Herts to run a similar project in Ware Trinity.

Dragons' Apprentice Challenge

The East Herts Challenge was launched at a successful event held on 1st October 2018 in Bishops Stortford. Schools participating in the Challenge are Chauncy School, Freman College, Richard Hale School, Simon Balle School, The Bishops Stortford High School and The Hertfordshire and Essex High School. Local organisations donating their time and expertise to support the Challenge as Dragon Mentors include East Herts Council, Hertfordshire County Council, Stansted Airport and Royal London Asset Management. The benefiting community groups are Guideposts (all EH), Carers in Hertfordshire, Breathe Easy Hertford, Southern Malting Arts Centre (Ware), TheGivingMachine (All EH/BS) and Mind in Mid Herts (All EH).

The East Herts Junior Dragons' Apprentice Challenge successfully launched at the end of 2018. Schools participating are Larkspur Academy (x2), Hertford St Andrew, Bishop's Stortford College - Prep School and Thundridge Primary. The Dragon Mentors are CVSBEH staff and the benefiting community groups are Ware in Bloom, East and North Hertfordshire Hospitals' Charity, Age Concern Bishops Stortford and East Herts Community Car Scheme. A second round of the Challenge is also launching in February 2019.
