1.0 <u>Background</u>

- 1.1 The County Council's Finance Director has advised that the County Council and Policy Authority precepts for 2011/12 as they affect East Hertfordshire District Council taxpayers will total £73,621,497.95 This is made up of £ 65,029,756.09 for the County Council and £8,591,741.86 for the Police Authority, giving Band D equivalents of £1,118.83 and £147.82 respectively.
- 2.0 <u>Contribution to the Council's Corporate Objectives</u>
- 2.1 The County Council and Police Authority precepts contribute to the setting of the Council Tax. East Herts District Council is the billing authority for the District and the setting of Council Tax is therefore a statutory duty of the Council.
- 2.2 There are no changes to the Band D equivalents from last year.
