<p>6a</p> <p>3/21/1576/OUT Silkmead Farm Industrial Estate Hare Street Hertfordshire SG9 0DX</p>	<p>Neighbour objection: proposal will bring considerable amount of heavy traffic into the small village of Barkway resulting in increased pollution and noise.</p> <p>Barkway Parish Council: raises concern reading lack of communication with adjacent villages that are likely to be affected development is unacceptable in the rural area and would be detrimental to these linear and historic villages (with listed buildings that directly line the road) including the fragile drainage system B1368 is not suitable for additional commercial traffic; most high street homes have vehicles parked on the High Street which causes congestion.</p> <p>A distribution hub should have better access to the main A and M roads to be economically viable and environmentally friendly.</p> <p>Barley Parish Council raises concern reading lack of consultation and traffic generation.</p>	<p>These comments have been put forward by other objectors and included within the committee report.</p> <p>The planning application has been advertised in accordance with the Council's Statement of Community Involvement 2019. This involves neighbouring property notification (by letter), site notice and press advert, and consultation with relevant Parish Councils and ward councillors.</p> <p>The Barkway and Barley Parish Councils are not located within East Herts District and as such would not be consulted directly on this application. Notwithstanding their comments are duly noted; they raise matters that have been raised by others and addressed in the committee report.</p>
